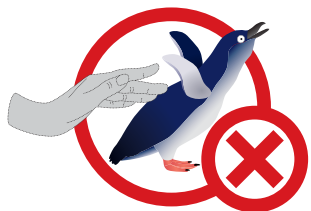
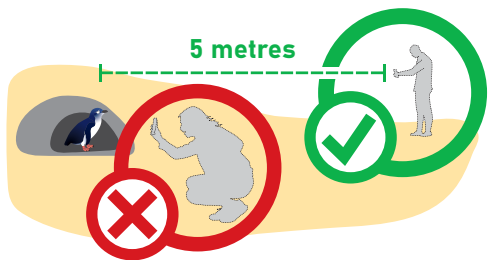


Please help to protect the Little Penguins



Do not touch or disturb penguins.



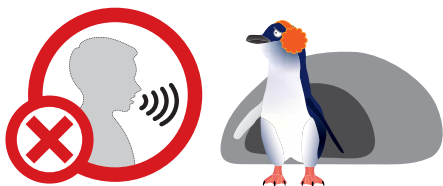
Keep your distance.

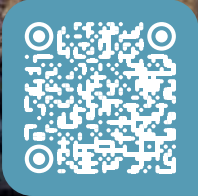
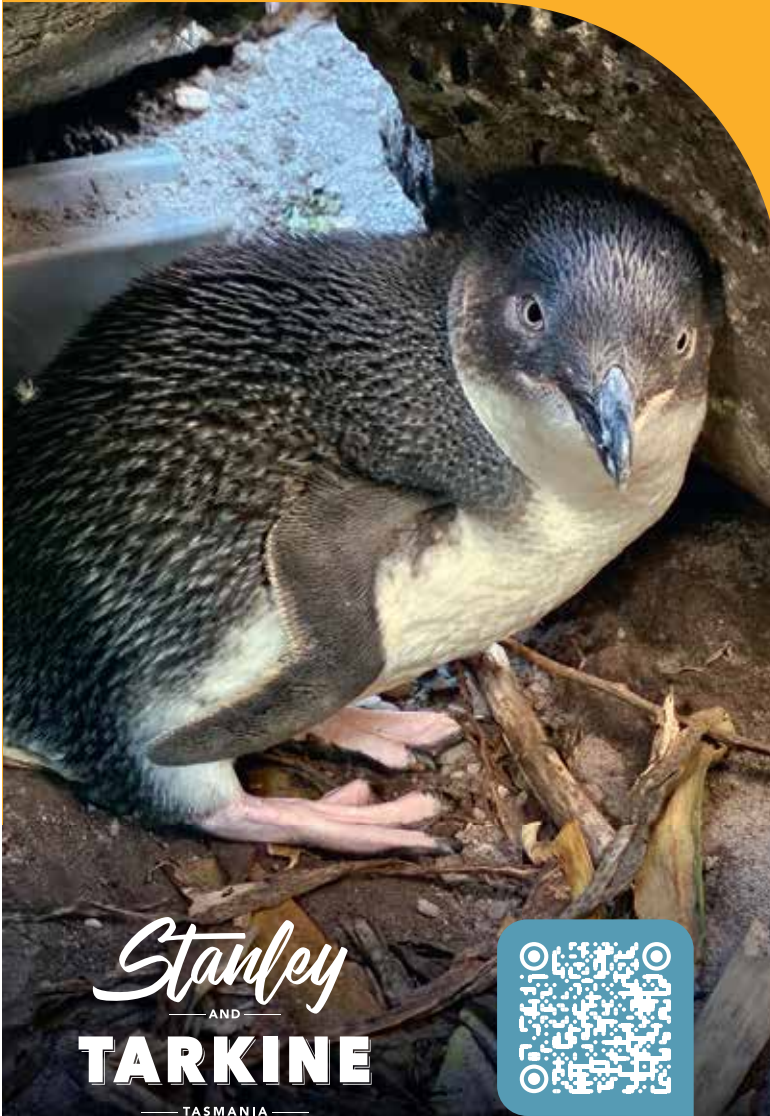

A Guide to Seeing Our **LITTLE PENGUINS**

When can you see the penguins?

Time of year: The penguins are most active from September to March.

Time of day: The best time to see penguins coming out of the water is about 30 – 45 minutes after sunset.

Shhhh...

So you don't scare the penguins - remain quiet, keep your voices low and keep movement to a minimum on the platform.

VIEWING PLATFORM

Where can you see the penguins?

The Godfreys Beach Viewing Platform in Stanley is especially designed for observing the Little Penguins in their natural environment without disturbance.

The platform has red lighting and is **ABSOLUTELY FREE!**

Please remember that these are wild birds and being able to view them in their natural habitat is very special.

Lights

No torches or flash photography permitted. Only photos without flash allowed.



PENGUINS ARE PROTECTED

- ! Penguins are protected wildlife. It is **ILLEGAL** to catch, attempt to catch or otherwise disturb or harass penguins. If this type of behaviour is observed, please report it to the nearest PWS Ranger. Offences are taken seriously and substantial penalties apply.
